

Blue Penguins Pukekura

At dusk, watch from just a few metres away as little penguins (kororā) emerge from the sea. The 90-minute tour includes a "behind the scenes" walk through the reserve to understand the penguin habitat and biology. Learn about Māori history and hear about intriguing stories that originated here. Then, as the sun sets, head to the observation deck to await the arrival of the world's smallest penguin. A not-to-be-missed wildlife tour with guaranteed sightings of penguins which makes for exceptional viewing.

City Walks

City Walks brings you unique access to the city's special people and places. Led by Athol, tours showcase Dunedin's key sites as he shares the character of the city, and the forces that have driven change here. The Old Town Walk (1.5-2 hours) is a comprehensive introduction to Dunedin featuring iconic sites including the Octagon, St Paul's Cathedral, Queens Gardens, and Dunedin Railway Station. The Vogel Street Walk (1hour) focuses on the redevelopment which has transformed Dunedin's warehouse precinct.



The Otago Peninsula Headland is arguably the most precious wildlife habitat in New Zealand and the farm owned by the Reid family is on the forefront. 
