




The peninsula is a destination in itself. It's the site of the Royal Albatross Centre, the only mainland northern royal albatross breeding colony in the world, and is the breeding grounds for some of the rarest species of penguin and sea lion. A well-timed visit might enable you to witness the Aurora Australis – Southern Lights – something you won't see at any other conference destination.





Step back in time

Larnach Castle is New Zealand's only castle and the fictional home of Prince Thomas of Lavania from the Netflix hit rom-com, The Royal Treatment. Olveston Historic Home is an elegant time capsule that doubles as a special dining venue for smaller groups.

Healthcare


The University of Otago's School of Dentistry, one of the top-50 ranked dental schools in the world, has had a \$130 million 'refresher' and is now the National Centre for Dentistry. With teaching clinics and a state-of-the-art research institute, researchers and clinicians are working together to develop solutions to oral health problems.

The \$1.4 billion hospital rebuild is underway and due for completion in 2025. It will be the biggest single hospital build the government has funded in New Zealand and will be at the forefront of innovation for medical technology and practice, even exploring where healthcare and gaming could connect for better patient outcomes.

Fiordland

Fiordland National Park is a world heritage site and is home to some of the most breath-taking scenery in New Zealand. It includes *Piopiotahi* Milford Sound and Patea Doubtful Sound. Described as the "Eighth Wonder of the World", this special place has famous walking tracks, unique wildlife and breath-taking views. Base camp for exploring the region, the township of Te Anau is located on the shores of New Zealand's second largest lake.



Invercargill & The Catlins

Waihōpai Invercargill is New Zealand's southernmost city and the gateway to Murihiku Southland.

Motupōhue Bluff, famous for its oysters, is nestled along a rugged coast. Mighty rivers and streams are found inland perfect for trout fishing. The Catlins area is a section of extraordinary coastline and native bush which is home to unique wildlife species and remains largely untouched. Rakiura Stewart Island is the ultimate ecotourism destination. Much conservation work has been done to protect this special island and its surrounds. There is plenty to do, with bird watching, star gazing, fishing, diving, hiking and visiting remote golden beaches just some of the options.




Central Otago

PROXIMITY MAP


