You will also have access to Unipol facilities at the University of Otago, including the gym, fitness classes,

World Café

These sessions are intended to be inclusive and collaborative by encouraging you to create a diverse network of friendship and meaningful



conversation. Each cafe has different content, context and goals - all intended to support young people in 2020/21.

The cafes are a fantastic way to encourage the understanding and acceptance of difference and diversity at school, tertiary study and in life. It is in these cafes that we MAKE BIG TALK - we leave out the small talk and get to know others by asking fun and thought-provoking questions and improving our English in the process! You will benefit from making meaningful connections with new friends and often with yourselves. The power of conversation is often ignored and these sessions will support and encourage conversation between speakers from many different countries, cultures and languages in welcoming, small group contexts established in consultation with you. There will be a lot of laughter, you will learn a lot (about yourself, others and the world around you).

The Big Lunch

The weekly shared lunch will celebrate



the Dunedin Programme whanau and welcome in guests to share our food and for them to share their knowledge, experience and information with you. The guests include local sports personalities, university and polytechnic speakers, a number of business speakers (talking with you about how they became specialists in their work) and guests invited that you tell us you want to hear from. International food will also be on the menu on Big Lunch Days in celebration of the wonderful cultural diversity of the wider Dunedin community.

Teams

We'll be putting you in to a team as part of the Programme experience. Teams will spend time together for some activities



and will compete against other teams in a series of fun challenges throughout the programme. The collaborative effort of a group to achieve a common goal or to complete a task presents engaging and challenging experiences for participants seeking to achieve a common goal in the most effective and efficient way.

As part of a Teams you will do mini-tours visiting and learning about the University of Otago and Otago Polytechnic and the study opportunities and resources available to you after high school. Guests from learning institutions will also be available for you to schedule appointments for further discussion on tertiary study options.

A Weekend Away

At the beginning of the Programme we will give you the option to sign up for a weekend away in Queenstown. We will
